## LESSON

Includes one lesson plan and 16 feelings flashcards.

GOALS	DESCRIPTION
The goal of this activity is to identify, express, and understand emotions through an interactive game.	This activity is appropriate and modified for all ages. <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• This activity is a card game that can be played with one or several emotions.</li><li>• This activity can be modified for groups of 2 or more.</li></ul>
MODALITIES	ACTIVITY
• Visual • Auditory • Kinesthetic • Interpersonal	<b>Introduction and Review (10 minutes)</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Engage in a brief discussion about emotions. Ask questions like:<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• What are emotions?</li><li>• How can we tell when someone is feeling a certain emotion?</li><li>• How do you express your emotions?</li></ul></li></ul> <b>Instructions (15 minutes)</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Explain that they will be playing a game called "Feelings Charades" to explore and express different emotions.</li><li>• Explain the rules of the game: acting without speaking, using only gestures and facial expressions. Emphasize that the students will be acting out the emotions and the other students will be guessing what they represent.</li></ul> <b>Warm-up Round (5 minutes)</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Emphasize to begin with a round of 5. Students have the playing cards.</li><li>• Encourage them to use words to describe how they feel.</li></ul> <b>Main Activity (10 minutes)</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Each time someone acts out an emotion card, the other students will be guessing what the emotion is.</li><li>• If the emotion is guessed correctly, the acting player will select another card and the time limit to guess the emotion will be reduced.</li><li>• Repeat until all emotions have been acted out and all cards have been identified.</li></ul>
MATERIALS	REFLECTION & CLOSURE
• Emotions flashcards	• Ask students to share the emotions they acted out. Ask questions like: <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• How did you feel when you were acting out that emotion?</li><li>• What was it like to play this game with the emotions of the players?</li></ul> <p>Why is it important to understand and express emotions? Ask to share a time when a strong emotion was experienced.</p>
EXTENSION	
Encourage students to create individualized emotion cards for future games. Discuss quality of emotions and understanding and expressing emotions in school.
