Why would the invasion be challenging for the Spanish? King Philip II of Spain had many reasons for launching the Spanish Armada to invade England in 1588. He had been building the armada for a while and planning how he could achieve his aims of <u>removing</u> Elizabeth from the throne and replacing her with a Catholic monarch.

Reasons for the Spanish invasion of England in 1588

RELIGION

- Philip was determined to make England a Catholic country again.
- Philip had strong support from the Pope who promised to forgive the sins of those who took part and reward Philip.
- Spain had already supported plots to remove Elizabeth, but they had failed. This was another more direct opportunity.
- Elizabeth had been helping the Dutch Protestants in the Netherlands. Phillip wanted revenge for this.

TACTICAL

- Spain also controlled Portugal which gave Philip more access to coastline, ships and ports to build ships and launch an invasion.
- The Duke of Parma had successfully controlled the Netherlands. The Spanish could use him as support.

POLITICS


- The Treaty of Joinville (1584) meant Spain could use the French port of Calais to take on more supplies.
- Phillip was angered when Elizabeth signed the Treaty of Nonsuch with Dutch Protestants. This effectively made them enemies.
- Philip was keen to expand his empire by invading England.
- Philip saw Elizabeth as a weak leader who hesitated to make decisions. He was confident that a Spanish invasion would be successful.

ECONOMIC

English privateers stole Spanish gold, silver and resources from the Americas which impacted the Spanish economy.

REVENGE

- Drake's attacks in the <u>Americas</u> left them without useful resources and treasures such as gold and silver.
- Drake's attack on <u>Cadiz</u> was a humiliation for Spain and disrupted preparations for the invasion.
