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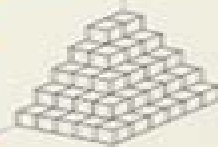

In addition, ten exams are included for each level of difficulty, where each exam consists of 8 problems, except those of the level 5, whose exams consist of 15 problems. To be able to face these problems successfully, no greater knowledge is required than that covered in the school curriculum; however, many of these problems require an ingenious approach to be tackled successfully. Students are encouraged to keep trying to solve each problem as a personal challenge as many times as necessary and to parents who continue to support their children in their disciplined preparation. Once an answer is obtained, it can be checked against the answers given after each group of exams.
