I. LEARNING OBJECTIVES:

Cognitive: Multiply 2- to 4- digit numbers by 1- to 2- digit number without regrouping
Psychomotor: Compute the product of 2 numbers with accuracy
Affective: Show accuracy/carefulness in solving number problems

Skill: Multiplying 2- to 4-digit numbers by 1- to 2- digit numbers without regrouping
Reference: BEC PELC LD.1.1.1.2,
Materials: flash cards, problem written on manila paper
Value: Accuracy/Carefulness

III. LEARNING EXPERIENCES:

A. Preparatory Activities

1. Drill : Multiplication Facts Stations

Assign Little Teachers for each of the Multiplication fact not yet mastered by the pupils then let each group move from one station to another to recite multiplication facts for 6, 7, 8 or nine.

Say:

Today, I'm going select a Little Teacher. Whoever will be able to recite the multiplication facts for a certain number will be our Little Teacher for its station . Then each group will be moving from one station to another to recite each multiplication facts. The little teacher will be listening closely as you recite because one mistake will mean minus 1 from the perfect score which is 10 so you will get 9 out of ten which will be recorded in your station cards. The group that gets the highest total score will be the winner.

2. Review

Recall the importance of accuracy and carefulness in doing things.

In $6 \times 3 = 24$. What do you call 8? 3? 24?

Put the factors and the products in the correct box?
