who have been marginalized by systemic racism in American schools she exposes the shortcomings of her classrooms
academic environments by challenging both the content and the methods of her education All too often these challenges are
framed as troublemaking and the students are disciplined for acting out instead of being rewarded for their intellectual
engagement Tadashi Dozono a professor of education and former high school social studies teacher takes seriously the often
overlooked critiques that students of color who get labeled as troublemakers direct toward their high school history
curriculum He reinterprets troublemaking usually cast as a behavioral deficit as an intellectual asset and form of reasoning
