Are cows the cause of global warming? Research suggests that cattle farms in the Netherlands account for over 65 percent of nitrogen emissions in agriculture (RIVM, 2019). These nitrogen emissions come from the nitrogen found in manure as it degrades into ammonia, which is then released into the environment and atmosphere. The calculations in this study demonstrate that this nitrogen pollution equates to more than 45 percent of the total nitrogen emissions in the country. To compare, households and road traffic are each responsible for just over six percent, while industry is responsible for one percent. Though efforts are under way to mitigate such emissions, there is a reluctance amongst policymakers to deal with the large scale of this problem. Though commensurate with this issue, the approach this paper presents is radical. This essay argues the government in the Netherlands must subsidize and stimulate livestock farmers - particularly cattle farmers - so they can transition to the more sustainable activity of vegetable farming. Firstly, it will establish how the current measures in place to mitigate the problem are inadequate. Then it will discuss the numerous advantages of the proposed results. Finally, it will address any potential objections in terms of economic grounds.
