First of all, A2/B1 students love to share their opinions. **For example**, they often use expressions such as "I agree" or "I disagree". Now, it is time for them to learn how to organize their ideas and share them in written form.

Secondly, A2/B1 students know how to write some complex sentences. **For instance**, they know how to share their reasons and give examples to support their opinions.

Finally, students will have to write a good opinion essay if they want to succeed in their IELTS, TOEFL, CELPIP, or Cambridge tests. **Therefore**, the sooner they develop this writing skill, the more likely they are to succeed.

Conclusion

It should be a **summary** of what you wrote in the **body** of your essay

To conclude, I think that A2/B1 learners are more than ready to learn how to write simple opinion essays. If students learn the basics of writing an opinion essay at lower levels, they will not struggle at higher levels or when taking a proficiency test.
