positive school psychology interventions offer a focus on mental health in order to set the stage and give students the opportunity for academic achievement Since the beginning of the positive psychology movement the application of its assumptions in schools has been one of the movement's main pillars The objective of the book is to help counsellors teachers and school leaders engage in a positive psychology research based practice in schools
