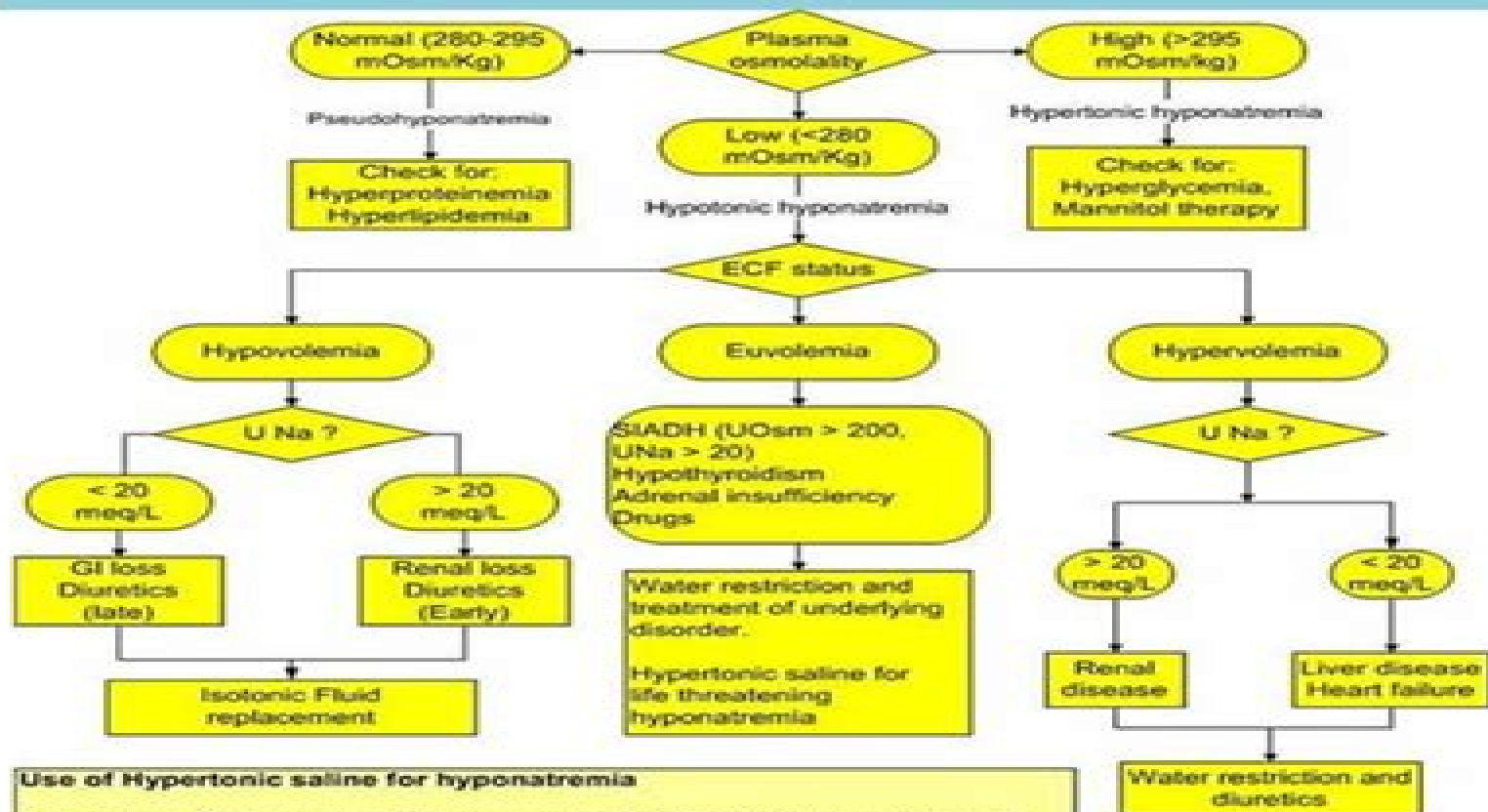


Hyponatremia (Na < 135 meq/L)



Use of Hypertonic saline for hyponatremia

Indications: Severe hyponatremia causing life-threatening symptoms e.g. seizures

Rate of correction: Not to exceed > 2.5 meq/l/hr or 15 meq/l/day

Calculation: meq NaCl needed = $0.6 \times \text{Wt in Kg} \times (\text{Desired Na} - \text{Actual Na})$
 1 Lit 3% NaCl = 513 meq NaCl
 3% NaCl in ml needed = $\frac{\text{meq NaCl needed} \times 1000}{513}$

Rate of infusion: Adjust to increase Na at 1-2.5 meq/L/hr

Check: Na Q 4 hrs
