

Diagnostic Evaluation of Articulation and Phonology (DEAP)

The Diagnostic Evaluation of Articulation and Phonology (DEAP) has a total of five tests with two screens and three assessments. This test is for children aged 3;0-6;11 years old. The Diagnostic Screener can help to determine if further testing is necessary, and which tests should be given. The Articulation Assessment includes evaluation for consonants and vowels at the word level. The Oral Motor Screen determines if any oral motor concerns are present. The Phonology Assessment assesses phonological skills at the word and connected speech levels. Word Inconsistency Assessment determines if there is any variability in the phonological errors that the child is producing.

The Diagnostic Screen determines further testing that could be necessary based on a child's articulation and phonology skills. The child is asked to name 10 pictures at the single word level to determine their single word production. The sounds that are in error are indicated on the record form. The articulation errors that **XX** had in error **WERE/WERE NOT** developmentally appropriate. The specific sounds that they produced in error were: **(LIST ERRORS HERE)**. Some words that **XX** produced in error were **(LIST EXAMPLES OF WORDS)**. They are also asked to imitate phonemes that were articulated incorrectly when naming the pictures to determine phoneme stimulability. **XX WAS/WAS NOT** stimulable for age-appropriate phonemes. The phonemes that the child can not produce are recorded to determine any phonological patterns. There **WERE/WERE NOT** phonological errors present. The phonological error patterns present were: **(INSERT ERROR PATTERNS)**. For example, **(LIST EXAMPLES OF WORDS HERE)**. Finally, the child is asked to name the pictures again to determine if there are any inconsistencies. The number of differences are added up and a single-word inconsistency score is generated. **XX's** score of **00 DOES/DOES NOT** meet criterion. Based on the results of this assessment **(INSERT DIAGNOSTIC SCREEN SUMMARY FROM RECORD FORM)** and **(INSERT DIAGNOSTIC SCREEN RECOMMENDATIONS FROM RECORD FORM)**.

The Articulation Assessment requires the child to name 30 pictures. The number of errors are counted and recorded, then the Articulation error score is calculated and converted to a scaled score. Scores within the average range are from 7-13. **XX** earned a score of **00**, which is considered **(INSERT DESCRIPTOR)**. This score can be further analyzed by percentage of consonants correct, percentage of vowels correct, and percentage of phonemes correct. Scores greater than 85% are considered within the Mild Articulation Severity. Then, the child is asked to imitate the sounds that were produced in error. This helps the examiner to determine what phonemes the child is stimulable and not stimulable for. Below is **XX's** percentage correct of consonants, vowels, and phonemes as well as the phonemes in error.
