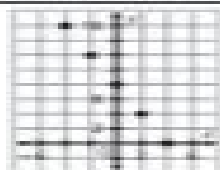
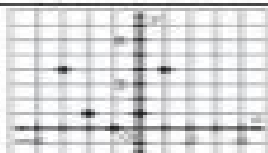

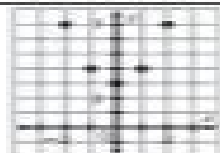
- | x | $y = -2x + 10$ | (x, y) |
|-----|------------------------|------------|
| -4 | $y = -2(-4) + 10 = 18$ | $(-4, 18)$ |
| -2 | $y = -2(-2) + 10 = 14$ | $(-2, 14)$ |
| 0 | $y = -2(0) + 10 = 10$ | $(0, 10)$ |
| 2 | $y = -2(2) + 10 = 6$ | $(2, 6)$ |
| 4 | $y = -2(4) + 10 = 2$ | $(4, 2)$ |



- | x | $y = (-x + 1)^2$ | (x, y) |
|-----|-------------------------|-----------|
| -3 | $y = (-(-3) + 1)^2 = 4$ | $(-3, 4)$ |
| -2 | $y = (-(-2) + 1)^2 = 1$ | $(-2, 1)$ |
| -1 | $y = (-(-1) + 1)^2 = 0$ | $(-1, 0)$ |
| 0 | $y = (0 + 1)^2 = 1$ | $(0, 1)$ |
| 1 | $y = (1 + 1)^2 = 4$ | $(1, 4)$ |

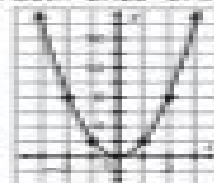


- | x | $y = x^2 + 3$ | (x, y) |
|-----|----------------------|-----------|
| -2 | $y = (-2)^2 + 3 = 7$ | $(-2, 7)$ |
| -1 | $y = (-1)^2 + 3 = 4$ | $(-1, 4)$ |
| 0 | $y = (0)^2 + 3 = 3$ | $(0, 3)$ |
| 1 | $y = (1)^2 + 3 = 4$ | $(1, 4)$ |
| 2 | $y = (2)^2 + 3 = 7$ | $(2, 7)$ |



- | x | $y = 2x^2$ | (x, y) |
|-----|-------------------|-----------|
| -2 | $y = 2(-2)^2 = 8$ | $(-2, 8)$ |
| -1 | $y = 2(-1)^2 = 2$ | $(-1, 2)$ |
| 0 | $y = 2(0)^2 = 0$ | $(0, 0)$ |
| 1 | $y = 2(1)^2 = 2$ | $(1, 2)$ |
| 2 | $y = 2(2)^2 = 8$ | $(2, 8)$ |

Draw a smooth curve through all the points to show all ordered pairs that satisfy the function. Draw arrowheads on both "ends" of the curve.



$$\begin{aligned} 9. & (m+2)(m+5) \\ &= m(m) + m(5) + 2(m) + 2(5) \\ &= m^2 + 5m + 2m + 10 \\ &= m^2 + 7m + 10 \end{aligned}$$

$$\begin{aligned} 92. \quad & (y - 7)(y + 2) \\ & = y(y) + y(2) - 7(y) - 7(2) \\ & = y^2 + 2y - 7y - 14 \\ & = y^2 - 5y - 14 \end{aligned}$$

$$\begin{aligned} 19. & (2a + 4)(5a + 6) \\ &= 2a(5a) + 2a(6) + 4(5a) + 4(6) \\ &= 10a^2 + 12a + 20a + 24 \\ &= 10a^2 + 32a + 24 \end{aligned}$$

$$\begin{aligned} \text{Ex. 2. } (x+7)(x+7) &= (x)^2 + 2x(7) + (7)^2 \\ &= x^2 + 28x + 7 \end{aligned}$$

13. $9t + 50t + 50 = (t^2 + 20t + 50) + (5t^2)$
 $= t^2 + 10t + 25$

74. $(3n - 5)(3n - 5) = (3n)^2 - 2(3n)(5) + (5)^2$
 $= 9n^2 - 30n + 25$

Factors of 1	Sum
1×1	$2 \neq 8$
$(-1) \times (-1)$	$-2 \neq 8$

$(x - 1)(x - 1)$
 $= (x - 1)^2$

Factors of 5	Sum
$5 = 1$	$5 \neq 1$
$(-5) = (-1)(5)$	$-5 \neq 1$

(a) $-(5)(a - 1)$

Factors of -2	Sum
$2 + -1$	1 \checkmark
$-2 + 1$	-1 \checkmark

$(x - 2)(x + 1)$

Factors of -12	Sum
$(-12) \cdot 1$	$-11 \neq$
$(-6) \cdot 2$	$-4 \neq$
$(-4) \cdot 3$	$-1 \checkmark$

So $-43(x + 3)$
