**Strand 1: Reading Process**

**Concept 6: Comprehension Strategies**

PC1. Predict events and actions, based upon prior knowledge and text features.

PC2. Compare a prediction about an action or event to what actually occurred within a text.

PC3. Ask relevant questions in order to comprehend text.

PC4. Answer clarifying questions in order to comprehend text.

PC5. Extract information from graphic organizers (e.g., webs, Venn diagrams, flow charts) to comprehend text.

PC6. Connect information and events in text to experience and to related text and sources.

GESDPC7. Reformulate elements and/or content in an appropriate graphic organizer.

GESDPC8. Summarize a written selection including the main ideas and relevant details.

**Topic: Literary Elements - Narrative**

**Strand 2: Literary Text Comprehension**

Comprehending Literary Text identifies the comprehension strategies that are specific in the study of a variety of literature.

**Concept 1: Literary Elements**

Students need to identify, analyze, and apply knowledge of the structure and elements of literature.

**Essential Questions:** What are the elements of a story? Do elements change in different stories?

**Big Idea:** Literary elements are the basic building blocks of a story.
