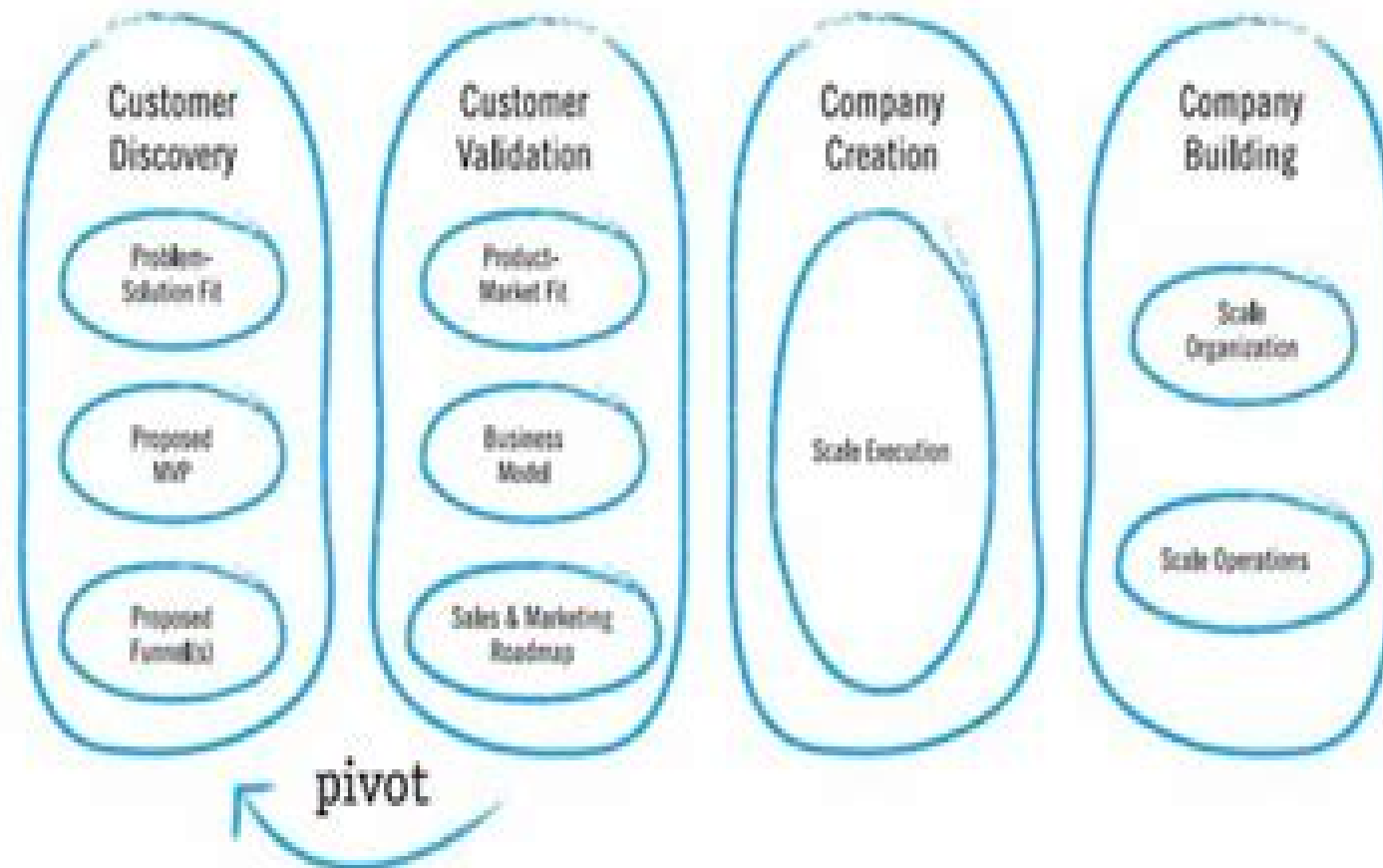


Figure 1: Steven Blank's Four Steps of Customer Development
