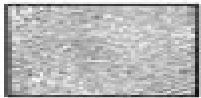

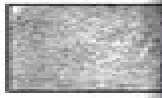

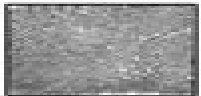
#### Fingerprints



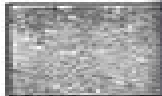
Loop



Whorl

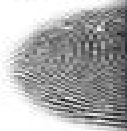
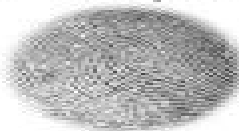


Arch



Tented Arch

- Loop - the ridges enter from one side, curve around, and return to the same side
- Whorl - the ridges form a circle or spiral
- Arch - the ridges enter from one side, rise in the center, and exit on the other side
- Tented Arch - at the center a sharp peak can be found
- Identify the pattern of each
