enterprise their undertaking of attaining freedom through business was curtailed by the reality of operating within the confines of US racial capitalism In tracing Black entrepreneurs across the Great Migration Freedom Enterprise provides important insights into African Americans activism for racial and economic justice and continued racialized wealth disparities
