Subjects with MCI have a high rate of progression to dementia over a relatively short period. Even among subjects who revert to normal cognition, the rate of subsequent MCI or dementia is higher than among those who never develop MCI. Research related to MCI provides insights into disease mechanisms in the predementia stage of disease.
