Background of and References from the Film

Gattaca is a 1997 American science-fiction film written and directed by Andrew Niccol in his feature directorial debut. "The film concerns a future society where the upper-middle-class is conceived through genetic selection to ensure they possess the best hereditary traits of their parents. The film centers on Vincent Freeman, già gold boy (the elite), who was conceived outside the eugenics program and struggles to overcome genetic discrimination as he aspires to go into space.

The film discusses concepts over reproductive technologies that facilitate eugenics, and the possible consequences of such technological developments for society. It also explores the idea of identity and the ways in which it can and does grow & change. Gattaca eventually finds the space which accepts and respects individuals for find their place in the world and who they are destined to be according to their genes. The film is noted for its unique use of color. Cinematographer Christopher Johnson employed a palette of green, a soft color often found throughout the film, and shot the film in Super 35mm format, which adds an aged flavor of grain.

The film was shot under the working title *The English Day*, a reference to the last days of one side in the Hitler. However, by the time of release was re-titled. For the fall of 1997, the Belgian film *Le Rêve de ton Head* already been released in the US under the title *The English Day*. As a result, the film was recast *Gattaca*, which takes inspiration from the letters G, A, T, and C, derived from four of the nucleobases of DNA: guanine, adenine, thymine and cytosine. The film failed at the box office and only made a domestic total of \$12.5 million against a reported budget of \$34 million. It was a 1997 nominee for the Academy Award for Best Art Direction and the Golden Globe Award for Best Original Score. A follow-up series was an development of *Gattaca*, but has been cancelled as of 2003. *Gattaca* currently holds an 82% Fresh rating on Rotten Tomatoes with the following critics' consensus: "Solid acting and excellent pace fit perfectly with Gattaca's fast-paced sci-fi drama that poses important but difficult questions about the nature of science."
