Your EE Topic, Title & Research Question

EE Topic - is the subject, issue or theme that you are investigating within Digital Society. The topic, which develops during the initial thinking about the EE, should later be reflected in the working of the title.

CE Talls - is a clear, summative statement that specifically focuses the topic being researched and appears on your title page. Your title should be short, descriptive and succinct and use key words that connect with the topic and Digital Society and attract the interest of a reader. Do not simply paraphrase your research question and use as your title.

EE Rewarch Question - your research question derives from the title and is expressed as a question that is intended to be answered through researching and writing the EE. It appears on the title page and could also be visible as a header throughout the essay. Your research question needs to be clear and flooused, use keywords that connect with the topic, the title, and Digital Society and support the development of an argument. Your research question should help to focus your research, providing a path through which you will
