

# HOW TO START AN ESSAY

## DEFINITION

Starting an essay is the process of introducing the topic, purpose and main argument or thesis statement to the reader. It aims to capture the reader's attention and provide the clear direction for the essay. It usually includes a hook, background information of the thesis statement. It is the first impression on the reader and sets the tone for the rest of the essay.

## EXAMPLE

1. Skip the Introduction
2. Brainstorm Five Key Points you want to Say
3. Use key points from your Lecture Slides
4. Use the Articles your Teacher Provided
5. Find Additional Articles from Google Scholar
6. Write an Essay Plan
7. Email your Teacher with your Ideas
