

Citing Textual Evidence

Writer's use quotation marks to show that they are using other writer's words to elaborate on their ideas.

What to do:

1. Set it up. Use a phrase (or a sentence starter) that let's the reader know you are going to use another's words or ideas.
2. Use a comma after the sentence starter.
3. Put quotation marks around the quotation.
3. (Normally punctuation goes inside of the quotation marks, but when you're using someone else's words it's a bit different)
4. Use parenthesis and put the author's last name and the page number to show whose words you're using. This is called a citation (Maxwell 42).
5. Put a period after the citation.
