A. Bond as a Hero

- a. Personified as perfect man/original action hero
- b. Early Bond is sexist by today's standards, but he comes off
 - i. Unwavering loyalty to Queen & country
 - ii. Live free Goldfinger about country from 006
- c. Morally Strong, never tempted by evil
 - i. product of Cold war, needed a slight enemy during war
 - ii. makes character humble, protective, love

B. Each actor possesses own style as Bond

- out of each new portray, a generation gets a new definition of...

- a. Connery - rough around the edges, rugged, manly, witty
 - i. tough, never let them see you bleed, rare emotion
 - ii. cold but portrayed in a likable way for 1960's audience
- b. Lazenby - more stylized, physical
 - i. note they cut some when he comes over his wife's bed
- c. Moore - boyish charm, clean, funny but more cheeky
 - i. 1970's were more fun, less toughness, still little wit
- d. Dalton - abrupt, more business-like
 - i. 1980's more sensitivity, stronger willed
 - ii. Did audiences not connect w/ this Bond?
- e. Brosnan - smooth, handsome, proper, calm, classy
 - i. Sensitive, polite, can't have sex w/ his love, only
- f. Craig - introduces a Bond similar to Connery
 - i. changed with a lot, more story than character, not from period
