Kalamatiano de Blumenthal, 2020-09-22 Folklore of Russia is folklore of Russians and other ethnic groups of Russia Russian folklore takes its roots in the pagan beliefs of ancient Slavs and now is represented in the Russian fairy tales Epic Russian bylinas are also an important part of Slavic mythology The oldest bylinas of Kievan cycle were actually recorded mostly in the Russian North especially in Karelia where most of the Finnish national epic Kalevala was recorded as well In the late 19th century Russian fairy tales began being translated into English with *Russian Folk Tales* by William Ralston and *Tales and Legends from the Land of the Tzar* by Edith Hodgetts Many Russian fairy tales and bylinas have been adapted for animation films or for feature movies by prominent directors such as Aleksandr Ptushko Ilya Muromets Sadko and Aleksandr Rou Morozko Vasilisa the Beautiful Some Russian poets including Pyotr Yershov and Leonid Filatov made a number of well known poetical interpretations of the classical Russian fairy tales and in some cases like that of Alexander Pushkin also created fully
