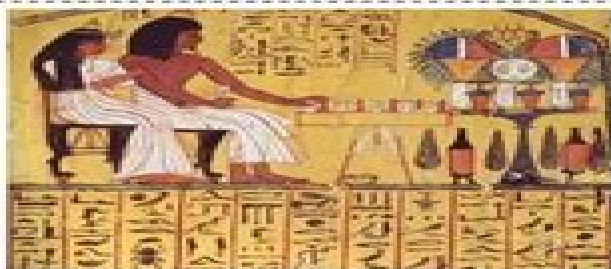
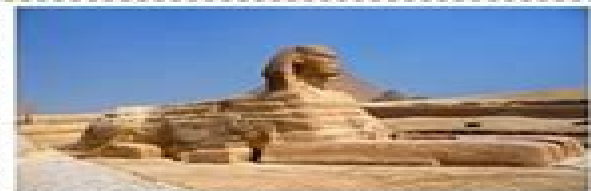


The Ancient Pyramids of Egypt
