#### ADVANCED PLACEMENT US HISTORY

#### Course Description

The Advanced Placement US History course is designed to provide students with the analytical skills and factual knowledge necessary to deal critically with the problems of US History. The demands upon the students should equip them to deal with intermediate and advanced college courses. Students will learn to assess historical materials - their relevance to a given interpretive problem, their reliability and their importance. In addition, students will be asked to analyze and interpret primary sources, including documentary material, maps, statistical tables, and pictorial and graphic evidence of historical events. Students will learn to take notes from printed material, lecture and discussion, and to write historical essays. They should be able to express themselves with clarity and precision and know how to cite sources and credit the writing and ideas of others. They must be able to make connections between facts and key themes of history. The themes will include discussions of American diversity, the development of a unique American identity, the evolution of American culture, demographic changes over the course of America's history, economic trends and transformations, environmental issues, the development of political institutions and the components of citizenship, social reform movements, the role of religion in the making of the United States and its impact in a multicultural society, the history of slavery and its legacies in this hemisphere, war and diplomacy, and the place of the United States in an increasingly global arena. The course will trace these themes throughout the year, emphasizing the ways in which they are interconnected and examining the ways in which each helps to shape the changes over time that are so important to understanding United States history.

Students who undertake APUSH must be motivated to do their work and master the facts of history, so that we may discuss the relationships between background and subsequent events. This is not a course for those who do not enjoy the reading and study of history. The facts are the tools, and it is the responsibility of each student to do what is necessary to master those facts. The teacher is a facilitator and a guide.
