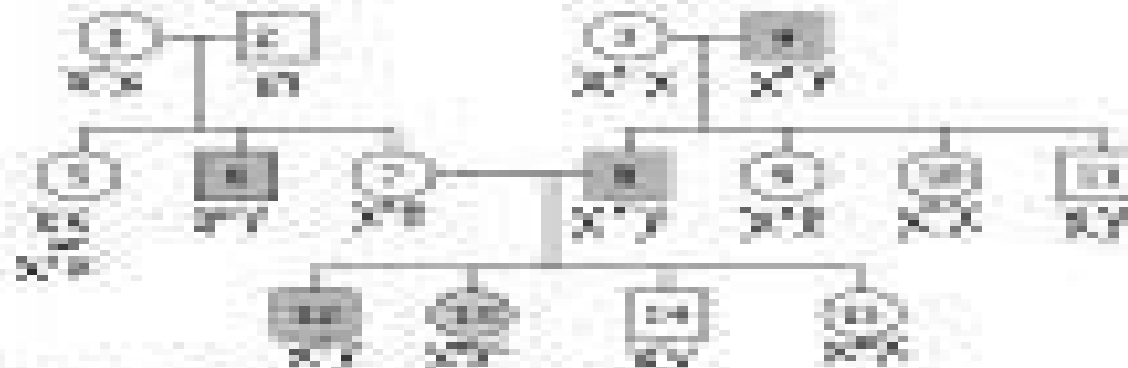


Genetics Practice Problems: Pedigree Tables

Remember the following when working pedigree tables:

- 1. Circles are females and squares are males.
- 2. A shaded circle or square indicates that a person has the trait.

The pedigree chart below is the inheritance of color blindness. Shaded individuals are colorblind. First, determine the probable genotype of person 1-15. Then answer the questions below the table.



What do you know about the genotype of the mother of 1-1?

These parents (1-1 and 1-2) had a color-blind son (1-4). His dad has no recessive, but color-blind allele. From his mother, since the mother is not shaded, she must be a carrier.

Number 1-6 is colorblind, just like his father. Where could he get his allele for colorblindness?

Yes, he inherited his allele for colorblindness from his mother. Must have been that 1-5 is a carrier. From her father.

Number numbers 1-1 and 1-2 were colorblind. How did they have a colorblind son (1-4)?

That mother must be a carrier for color blindness.

What must be the genotype of the parents of a colorblind daughter? Explain.

To have a color-blind daughter, she must have the recessive allele on both of her parents. Her father must be X^bY and mother must have X^bX^b or X^bX .

If mother 1-5 has a normal son, what is the probability that their son will be colorblind?

$X^BX^b \times X^bY \rightarrow$ all of their sons will have color-blindness.

$\begin{matrix} \text{1-5} \\ \text{XX} \end{matrix} \times \begin{matrix} \text{1-6} \\ \text{XY} \end{matrix} \rightarrow$ all of their sons will have color-blindness.
