

The editor asserts that schools should focus on developing students' capacity and disposition in knowledge creation work at the same time; leaders and teachers alike should continue to develop their professional knowledge as a community. In the knowledge building vernacular, the chapters are knowledge artifacts—artifacts that not only document the findings of the editors and authors but that also mediate future advancement in this area of research work. The ultimate aim of the book is to inspire new ideas and to illuminate the path for researchers of similar interest in knowledge creation in education.
