How should Americans solve the problem of gun violence in the United States? If you choose this topic select 1 policy or change people should make and argue for that change. Include what people against that change argue.

ONE THING TO IMPROVE EDUCATION

Advocate for one policy change, curriculum change or anything else that will improve education where you live. Convince people why they should make that change. Include what people against that change argue.

FREE COLLEGE EDUCATION

Should public colleges and universities have free tuition? Research different tuition options. Examine opposing POVs. Argue for or against free college education.

BUYING ESSAYS & RESEARCH PAPERS

Should students buy essays online? Look at the research of how many students buy essays, and why they buy essay from companies. Then argue for against buying essays.
