3. Feminists, such as Anne Oakley highlight male dominance or patriarchy within the family. This can be seen, for example in the way in which money may be controlled or managed by the man, usually due to the man being the main breadwinner and the woman being the housewife and carer. This may put men in control of important money making decisions, not allowing women to have a say.

4. With the increase in secularisation across Britain, there has been a weakening of religious values, and with that values towards morality and acceptance of different families and relationships have changed. The loss of religion has also had an impact on the political world, for example, in 2013 The Same Sex Marriages Act allowed for some legal parity between heterosexual and homosexual relationships, in the eyes of the law. As a result of these changes, families and households have become more diverse, in this instance with more same-sex couples.

5. The statistics in Item A only provides numerical or quantitative data on the numbers of divorces, it doesn't provide any qualitative data or detailed valid information, for example, the main reasons for divorce.

6. The data in Item A comes from government collected official statistics on the numbers of divorces in England and Wales. The data illustrates that the trend for divorce is generally increasing, which may be explained by a number of reasons. One factor which may account for this increasing trend is the influence of feminism on personal relationships, meaning that women are less likely to accept unequal treatment in a marriage or that women are more likely to be in a stronger financial position to support themselves and their children alone without their husband's financial assistance.

7. One disadvantage of secondary data may be that the information gathered is unrepresentative. As the data isn't collected first-hand, it may not be clear which sociological method was used as the primary form of research. In light of this, it is difficult to see how representative the data is of a range of different social groups. If the research was only conducted in one or two areas, and with a limited number of people, it is unlikely that every class, age, gender, ethnicity, disability and sexuality will have been consulted. This means that the data cannot be seen to be truly representative of the whole population.

8. Willmott and Young used the research method of semi-structured interviews to conduct their study. They interviewed '...almost 2000 individuals living in London' and asked them all the same questions. Their perspective was Functionalism, which centres around the family having a vital purpose to society and its members, with the belief that the nuclear family is the best fit for modern society. Their study centred around the nuclear family in the 1970's and the belief that the roles had become more symmetrical in that domestic responsibilities were increasingly shared between husband and wife in a complimentary manner. As Item B states '...husband and wife were increasingly sharing their chores around the house...' The findings illustrated the changing nature of family life and the personal relationships within it, as a result of the advent and spread of feminism and changes within the law, such as The Equal Pay Act of 1970.
