

Lesson Plan: Discovering Theme Through Shirley Jackson's *The Lottery* with a Classroom Jigsaw

****Lesson intended to be taught after students have read the story.****

Objectives:

- I. Students will be able to define literary theme.
- II. Students will be able to determine a theme of *The Lottery* by analyzing quotes from the story.
- III. Students will be able to connect themes within *The Lottery* to their lives.

Materials:

- Worksheet for each student
- Quote strip for each student (directions on PowerPoint in zip drive)
- Texts of *The Lottery*

Preparation:

- Due to copyright restrictions, full quotes cannot be printed here but directions are included in the accompanying PowerPoint within this zip drive. You will need 1 quote strip for each student to print out as many as one needed for your class.
- Print worksheet (double-sided if possible) for each student.

As students enter the room, distribute 1 quote strip and 1 worksheet per student.

Warm-up:

"In your own words, what is theme?" 2-3 min writing time, then share responses. Work to come up with a class definition for theme and write on the board. Something along the lines of: "the underlying meaning a writer explores in a literary work."

Explanation:

Address class: "In order for us to come to a deeper understanding of what is going on beneath the surface of this dark tale, we will be performing a close reading of several of the story's prominent quotes that deal with tradition and human nature. We will do this by way of a Classroom Jigsaw. When you walked into the room, each of you received a quote. Look at the number on the quote....."
