Rentier Islamism Courtney Jean Freer, 2018 While scholars have long looked at the role of political Islam in the Middle East it has been assumed that domestic politics in the wealthy monarchical states of the Arabian Gulf so called rentier states where taxes are very low and oil wealth subsidizes the needs of citizens are largely unaffected by such movements Using contemporary history and original empirical research Courtney Freer updates traditional rentier state theory and argues that political Islam serves as a prominent voice and tool to promote more strictly political and often populist or reformist views supported by many Gulf citizens

Norms in Conflict Anchalee Rüland, 2022-06-14 The people of Myanmar were struck by three major human rights disasters during the country's period of democratization from 2003 to 2012 the 2007 Saffron Revolution the aftermath of Cyclone Nargis in 2008 and the 2012 Rakhine riots which would evolve into the ongoing Rohingya crisis These events saw Myanmar's government categorically labeled as an offender of human rights and three powerful Southeast Asian member states Indonesia Thailand and Malaysia responded to the violations in very different ways In each case their responses to the crises were explicitly shaped by norm conflict which may be understood as a tension between international and domestic norms Their reactions were compelled by a need to address conflicting domestic and international expectations for norm compliance regarding human rights protection and non interference in internal affairs In *Norms in Conflict* Southeast Asia's Response to Human Rights Violations in Myanmar Anchalee Rüland makes sense of state action that occurs when a governing body is faced with a circumstance that is at once in line with and contrary to its own governing policies She defines five different types of response strategies to situations of norm conflict and examines the enabling factors that lead to each strategy Domestic norms are known to evolve as a country's values change over time yet Rüland argues that the old and new norms may also coexist knowledge of the underlying political context is crucial for those seeking a solid understanding of state behavior *Norms in Conflict* challenges the conventional understanding of the logic of consequences in determining state behavior advancing constructivist theory and establishing a provocative new conversation in international relations discourse

Kurds and Yazidis in the Middle East Günes Murat Tezcür, 2021-01-28 The diversity of Kurdish communities across the Middle East is now recognized as central to understanding both the challenges and opportunities for their representation and politics Yet little scholarship has focused on the complexities within these different groups and the range of their experiences This book diversifies the literature on Kurdish Studies by offering close analyses of subjects which have not been adequately researched and in particular by highlighting the Kurds relationship to the Yazidis Case studies include the political ideas of Ehmede Xani the father of Kurdish nationalism Kurdish refugees in camps in Iraq the perception of the Kurds by Armenians in the late Ottoman Empire and the Turks in modern Western Turkey and the important connections and shared heritage of the Kurds and the Yazidis especially in the aftermath of the 2014 ISIS attacks The book comprises the leading voices in Kurdish Studies and combines in depth empirical work with theoretical and

conceptual discussions to take the debates in the field in new directions The study is divided into three thematic sections to capture new insights into the heterogeneous aspects of Kurdish history and identity In doing so contributors explain why we need to pay close attention to the shifting identities and the diversity of the Kurds and what implications this has for Middle East Studies and Minority Studies more generally

Nationalism, Law and Statelessness John R. Campbell, 2013-07-18 In 1998 a bloody war erupted in The Horn of Africa between Ethiopia and Eritrea During the war Ethiopia arrested and expelled 70 000 of its citizens and stripped another 50 000 plus of their citizenship on the basis of their presumed ethnicity Nationalism Law and Statelessness Grand Illusions in the Horn of Africa examines the events which led up to the war documents the expulsions and denationalisations that took place and follows the flight of these stateless Ethiopians out of the Horn into Europe The core issue examined is the link between sovereignty and statelessness as this plays out in The Horn of Africa and in the West The book provides a valuable insight into how nations create and perpetuate statelessness the failure of law both national and international to protect and address the plight of stateless persons and the illusory nature of nationalism citizenship and human rights in the modern age The study is one of a very few which examines the problem of statelessness through the accounts of stateless persons themselves This book will be of great interest to students and researchers in anthropology law politics African studies and refugee studies as well as professionals and all those interested in stateless persons in the West including Eritreans who continue to be denied basic rights

Hubris, Self-Interest, and America's Failed War in Afghanistan Thomas P. Cavanna, 2015-07-22 This book describes the conduct of the US led post 9 11 war in Afghanistan Adopting a long term perspective it argues that even though Washington initially had an opportunity to achieve its security goals and give Afghanistan a chance to enter a new era it compromised any

possibility of success from the very moment it let bin Laden escape to Pakistan in December 2001 and found itself locked in a strategic overreach. Given the bureaucratic and rhetorical momentum triggered by the war on terror in America, the Bush Administration was bound to deploy more resources in Afghanistan sooner or later despite its focus on Iraq. The need to satisfy unfulfilled counter terrorism objectives made the US dependent on Afghanistan's warlords, which compromised the country's stability and tarnished its new political system. The extension of the US military presence made Washington lose its leverage on the Pakistan army leaders who, aware of America's logistical dependency on Islamabad, supported the Afghan insurgents, their historical proxies, more and more openly. The extension of the war also contributed to radicalize segments of the Afghan and Pakistani populations, destabilizing the area further. In the meantime, the need to justify the extension of its military presence influenced the US-led coalition into proclaiming its determination to democratize and reconstruct Afghanistan. While highly opportunistic, the emergence of these policies proved both self-defeating and unsustainable due to an inescapable collision between the US-led coalition's inherent self-interest, hubris, limited knowledge, limited attention span, and limited resources, and on the other hand, Afghanistan's inherent complexity. As the critical contradictions at the very heart of the campaign increased with the extension of the latter's duration, scale, and cost, America's leaders, entrapped in path dependence, lost their strategic flexibility. Despite debates on troops, resource allocation, and more sophisticated doctrines, they repeated the same structural mistakes over and over again. The strategic overreach became self-sustaining until its costs became intolerable, leading to a drawdown which has more to do with a pervasive sense of failure than with the accomplishment of any noble purpose or strategic breakthrough.

When Business Harms Human Rights Karen Erica Bravo, Jena Martin, Tara L.
