Minimum Entry Requirements for all applicants

Interested applicants should must the following minimum requirements:

- a Mulawi School Certificate of Education or any equivalent O-Level qualification with at least 4 subjects passed with credit (6 subjects for some programmes) including ENGLISH LANGUAGE and other subjects specified in the table under point (d) below.
- B) A University of Malawi Diploma er, a relevant Diploma from accredited programmes of the University of Malawi such as those offered at Domasi College of Education, Natural Resources College, Malawi College for Health Sciences, Theological College, St. John of God College as an equivalent Diploma from a recognised institution of higher learning.
- A minimum of 2 years post Diploma relevant work experience in a field related to the programme applied for.
