can different disciplines share common conceptual schemes?

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Title 2: concerns whether more knowledge increases doubt and includes a Goethe quote.

Thoughts to consider with essay 2 include:

what is a paradox?

to what extent is the growth of knowledge the growth of our conceptual schemes?

is the ability to ask new questions simply increased ignorance or increased doubt?

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Title 3: concerns whether knowledge requires an assumption of uniformity.

Thoughts to consider with essay 3 include:

what are the different kinds of uniformity?

is the possession of a concept knowing a rule?

do laws of nature exist in reality or only in our minds?
