

Foreword

As part of the implementation process of the National Policy for Early Childhood Development (ECD) of 2017, the Ministry of Gender, Community Development & Social Welfare (MoGCDSW) in Collaboration with UNICEF, World Bank, UNESCO and other key partners developed a National Syllabus for IECD to address the holistic needs of children 0-5 years of age. The current revised syllabus is a successor of the previous syllabus which was developed in 2014. The need to review and revise the IECD syllabus, arose in order to align it to the new curriculum framework and ECD Policy which focus at addressing the needs of the whole child adequately.

Initially, the syllabus (2003) focused on four developmental domains of children (i.e. physical, mental, social/emotional, moral and spiritual). However, since 2014, the country's focus is on nurturing the child to holistically develop all the six developmental domains and addressing the needs of children including pregnant and lactating mothers in the areas of health, nutrition, hygiene and sanitation, protection, psycho-social care, and HIV/AIDS.

Therefore, the revised syllabus incorporates all the six developmental domains (Physical; Cognition and General Knowledge; Social and Emotional Development; Approaches towards learning, Language, Literacy and Communication; and Spiritual and Moral Development; and has introduced 7 themes which include: Health; Mathematical and numerical knowledge; Spirituality; Self-awareness; Language; Environment; and Technology. These thematic areas will promote early learning and stimulation, nutrition, protection, love and affection, hygiene and sanitation as well as mothers well-being both at household and community level.

Even though the syllabus is designed to target Community Based Childcare Centers where primary care at community level for children 0-5 is taking place, it is hoped that this syllabus will be used by all institutions involved in child welfare including private ECD centres in both urban and peri-urban areas. It is also expected that this syllabus will facilitate implementation of transition services for pre-school children from CBCC to Primary school infant classes. In this regard, the syllabus will bring a nexus between the content which caregivers and primary school teachers cover at CBCC and primary infant classes.

Bridges and Barriers Eddie Williams, 2014-06-03 Recent decades have seen sub Saharan Africa decline in both economic and human terms The rich North has responded with a barrage of well publicized initiatives from pop concerts to international commitments on debt relief aid trade and good governance Among the complex of factors necessary to sustain economic and human development education receives little media coverage although it is crucial However education must be effective This book argues that in Anglophone Africa education is not effective because of the use of English rather than children's first languages both as the medium of instruction and also as the language in which children are first taught to read Research is presented from Malawi and Zambia countries with contrasting language policies using evidence from tests in English and African languages small group discussions and classroom observation The findings show that English medium policies in Africa do not give students any advantage in English over first language policies while the use of English discriminates against girls and rural children The book concludes that much education in Africa is a barrier rather than a bridge to learning because of the prevailing language ideology which has resulted in massive over estimation of the value of English While appropriate language policies alone will not solve education and development difficulties in Africa they do have a positive contribution to make The evidence presented here suggests they are failing to make that contribution
