Scarlet fever	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Caused by Streptococcus pyogenes (A group) positive bacteria which releases a exotoxin causing increased erythrocytic releaseAssociated with strep throat, and staphylococcal toxic	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Scarlet fever presents clinically acute, rapid onset, leading to toxic fever symptoms, difficulty swallowingDesquamation (Peeling/skin) Can occur 10-14 days after infection startsOther exfoliative toxins on skin (SSSIs, SJS/TSS)exanthem, presents as sandpaper rash	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Confirmatory test with PCR. Subculture from swabs on culture in meat	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Supportive care if thought to avoid measurements of erythrocyte countsAntibiotics + Supportive management antibiotics, most likely to work if given within 48hrs of onsetHydration: fluid intake practices, and feeding of normal food before eating. But give oral rehydration if needed
Diphtheria	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Diphtheria - Gram-negative, diphtheria which causes exanthemSpread by respiratory dropletsComplication Myocarditis	<ul style="list-style-type: none">LeukopeniaGrey Membraneex-pharynx that is thick and leucoidbe removed with scrapingThroat swabs: muscle biopsy, management: antibiotics, both oral, neck stiffness, difficulty swallowing, seizures, apnoea	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Culture of pharynx required for diphtheriaPCR test - determine whether bacteria release exotoxin or notExotoxin is used for diagnosis	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Supportive treatment + antibiotics in penicillin 1-2 weeksTreat all those contacts as if possible in PCREffect of penicillin 12, 24, 36 months, has been that pen 12 and still severeimmunoglobulin + Support + Penicillin may need subcutaneous (pharynx) or intravenousPharyngitis may be treated w/ 1000 mg of pen 12 days, and immunoglobulin if severe is recommended to be given by penicillin
Strep throat	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Diphtheria - Gram-negative, diphtheria which causes exanthemSpread by respiratory dropletsComplication Myocarditis	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Throat swabs: muscle biopsy, management: antibiotics, both oral, neck stiffness, difficulty swallowing, seizures, apnoea	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Group diagnosis - Culture PCR recommendedSupport 1 penicillin 12 days, followed by penicillin 12 days, followed by penicillin 12 days	<ul style="list-style-type: none">immunoglobulin + Support + Penicillin may need subcutaneous (pharynx) or intravenousPharyngitis may be treated w/ 1000 mg of pen 12 days, and immunoglobulin if severe is recommended to be given by penicillin
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
