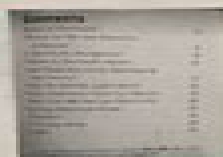

 - Make the text more FUN!

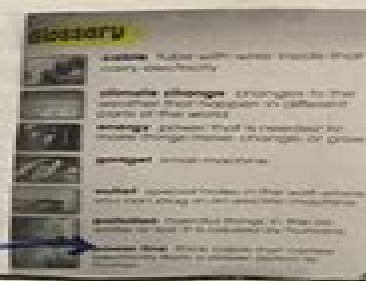
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Tells us what is in the book and the page it is on.
