**Rural youth and employment in Ethiopia** Schmidt, Emily, Bekele, Firew, 2016-12-22 This paper examines labor diversification in Ethiopia focusing on youth and explores current conditions that youth face in both the agricultural and non farm labor markets Using data from the Ethiopia Socioeconomic Survey ESS and the National Labor Force Survey NLFS we explore current trends in labor diversification along with youth non farm engagement in rural and small towns We find that youth ages 25 to 34 years have a greater probability of working in non farm enterprises compared to mature individuals age 35 64 However wage labor opportunities remain scant in rural Ethiopia The majority of individuals working in non farm employment are engaged in small scale trade activities
