and principals from a less economically developed district had less awareness of involvement in and understanding of school culture development in all its aspects A notable gap between teachers and principals was identified in their perception of the core values and norms of the school and of communication between teachers and principals This study suggests that for educational development to be further carried forward successfully there is an urgent need for better distribution of educational resources both financial and leadership common understanding agreed upon goals and efficient communication between principals and teachers
