- ☐ Does each body paragraph contain a conclusion statement?

CONCLUSION

- ☐ Does the conclusion contain at least three sentences?
- ☐ Does the conclusion refer back to the thesis statement?

COHERENCE

- ☐ Do the ideas flow logically and contribute to a building argument?
- ☐ Are transitions used correctly?
- ☐ Is the essay interesting and engaging?
- ☐ Does the analysis presented in the paper support the thesis statement?
- ☐ Is the sentence structure varied?
