the welfare state and socio educational activities in current programs and policies The current transformation processes in the welfare state are making the relationship between families and the state more dynamic in general and they are structuring the discourses on the childrearing education and child care services in the fields of both public and private responsibility The introduction of all day schooling in Germany also has to be viewed in this context This is gradually changing the traditional half day structure of German schools and shifting the borders of public and private responsibility on the levels of education child care and childrearing institutions The attention given to parental childrearing and educational responsibility within the context of current national and international debates clearly underlines the fact that issues in private life are increasingly entering the public discourse and becoming subject to attempts at socio political control This raises the assumption of an increasing politicization of parenthood in the post welfare state that is focusing more and more attention on the structural conditions of gainful employment and child care as well as on the current relations between the genders This context particularly emphasizes the time and care regimes that decisively determine the practices in daily family life and the utilization of all day education settings
