

Global Monitoring Report 2014/2015 World Bank; International Monetary Fund, 2014-10-21 The Global Monitoring Report 2014 2015 Ending Poverty and Sharing Prosperity was written jointly by the World Bank Group WBG and the International Monetary Fund with substantive inputs from the Organisation for Economic Co operation and Development This year s report details for the first time progress toward the WBG s twin goals of ending extreme poverty by 2030 and promoting shared prosperity and assesses the state of policies and institutions that are important for achieving them The report continues to monitor progress on the Millennium Development Goals MDGs Also for the first time the report includes information about high income countries It finds that while gaps in living standards have been closing in many countries the well being of households in the bottom 40 percent as measured by the non income MDGs such as access to education and health services remains below that of households in the top 60 percent The focus of this year's report is on three elements needed to make growth more inclusive and sustainable investment in human capital that favors the poor the best use of safety nets and steps to ensure the environmental sustainability of economic growth These three elements are imperative to all countries development strategies and are also fundamental to global efforts to achieve the twin goals the MDGs and the Sustainable Development Goals that will succeed the MDGs Global Monitoring Report 2014 2015 was prepared in collaboration with regional development banks and other multilateral partners Global Monitoring Report 2015/2016 World Bank; International Monetary Fund, 2015-11-02 The Global Monitoring Report 2015 2016 produced by the World Bank Group in partnership with the International Monetary Fund comes at an inflection point in both the setting of global development goals and the demographic trends affecting those goals This year marks the end of the Millennium Development Goals MDGs and the launching of the Sustainable Development Goals SDGs while the World Bank Group has in parallel articulated the twin goals of sustainably ending extreme poverty and sharing prosperity This report presents the latest global poverty numbers based on the 2011 purchasing power parity PPP data and examines the pace of development progress through the lens of the evolving global development goals The special theme of this year's report examines the complex interaction between demographic change and development With the number of children approaching a global ceiling of two billion the world's population is growing slower It is also aging faster with the share of people of working age starting a decline in 2013 But the direction and pace of these trends vary starkly across countries with sizeable demographic disparities between centers of global poverty marked by high fertility and drivers of global growth marked by rapid aging These demographic disparities are expected to deeply affect the pursuit of the post 2015 agenda accentuating existing challenges and creating new opportunities Poverty and Shared Prosperity 2018 World Bank, 2018-12-20 The World Bank Group has two overarching goals End extreme poverty by 2030 and promote shared prosperity by boosting the incomes of the bottom 40 percent of the population in each economy As this year's Poverty and Shared Prosperity report documents the world

continues tomake progress toward these goals In 2015 approximately one tenth of the world's population lived in extreme poverty and the incomes of the bottom 40 percent rose in 77 percent of economies studied But success cannot be taken for granted Poverty remains high in Sub Saharan Africa as well as in fragile and conflict affected states At the same time most of the world's poor now live in middle income countries which tend to have higher national poverty lines. This year's report tracks poverty comparisons at two higher poverty thresholds 3 20 and 5 50 per day which are typical of standards in lower and upper middle income countries In addition the report introduces a societal poverty line based on each economy s median income or consumption Poverty and Shared Prosperity 2018 Piecing Together the Poverty Puzzle also recognizes that poverty is not only about income and consumption and it introduces a multidimensional poverty measure that adds other factors such as access to education electricity drinking water and sanitation It also explores how inequality within households could affect the global profile of the poor All these additional pieces enrich our understanding of the poverty puzzle bringing us closer to solving it For more information please visit worldbank org PSP **Shared Prosperity and Poverty Eradication in Latin** America and the Caribbean Louise Cord, MarÃa Genoni, Carlos RodrÃguez-CastelÃin, 2015-06-18 Over the last decade Latin America and the Caribbean region has achieved important progress towards the World Bank Group's goals of eradicating extreme poverty and boosting income growth of the bottom 40 percent propelled by remarkable economic growth and falling income inequality Despite this impressive performance social progress has not been uniform over this period and certain countries subregions and even socioeconomic groups participated less in the growth process As of today more than 75 million people still live in extreme poverty in the region using 2 50 day capita half of them in Brazil and Mexico and extreme poverty rates top 40 percent in Guatemala and reach nearly 60 percent in Haiti This means that extreme poverty is still an important issue in both low and middle income countries in the region As growth wanes and progress in reducing the still high levels of inequality in the region slows it will be more important than ever for governments to focus policies on inclusive growth The book includes an overview that highlights progress towards the goals of poverty eradication and shared prosperity between 2003 and 2012 unpacks recent gains at the household level using an income based asset model and examines some of the policy levers used to affect social outcomes in the region It draws on 13 country studies eight of which are featured in this volume Argentina Brazil Colombia El Salvador Mexico Paraguay Peru and Uruguay The other case studies include Bolivia Chile Dominican Republic Ecuador and Honduras which will be included in the web version of the Egypt, Jordan, Morocco and Tunisia Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations, 2018-06-27 The book following collection of notes was initially disseminated at the Private Sector Forum on Food Security in the Southern and Eastern Mediterranean Region jointly organized by the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations FAO the European Bank for Reconstruction and Development EBRD and the Union for the Mediterranean UfM in May 2015 The notes aim to inform EBRD agribusiness investments in the SEMED and disseminate knowledge on current trends in agribusiness
