in which they reside The book draws on original research among third generation Japanese and Jewish Brazilians to determine the seemingly paradoxical ways in which the descendants of immigrants choose which identities to emphasize in the political arena It shows that immigrant communities strategies of political incorporation and social integration are framed within where they fall in existing ethno racial and socioeconomic hierarchies and that perceptions of discrimination drive third generation descendants to vote in line with their ethnic interests One particularly interesting finding is that in Brazil a country that suffers from high levels of political corruption Japanese Brazilian politicians are often incentivized to emphasize their Japanese ness over their Brazilian ness to convey to voters that they are more honest as political candidates than their more Brazilian opponents Finally ethnic community based organizations allow these groups to leverage their identities transnationally
