Anatomy of the Heart

Location = in the center of the lungs, behind the sternum, 2/3 of the heart lies to the left of midline and 1/3 lies to the right of midline


- Base of heart (top) = 2nd intercostal space
- Apex of heart (bottom) = 5th intercostal space, midclavicular line (*point of maximal impulse

is located here)

Function = primary function is to circulate blood throughout the body

Interior of the heart:

- Chambers
 - 2 upper chambers (right atrium and left atrium) = receive incoming blood
 - 2 lower chambers (right ventricle and left ventricle) = pump blood out of the heart
