This popular theory encourages learners to build on past experiences and knowledge, use their intuition, imagination and creativity, and search for new information to discover facts, correlations and new truths (figurer, 1966).

What are examples of discovery learning activities

- Researching information
- Manipulating objects.

This is a teacher-centered approach in which the teacher is the dispenser of knowledge, the arbitrator of truth, and the final evaluator of learning. A teacher's job from this perspective is to supply students with a designated body of knowledge in a predetermined order.

Science process skills are described as the ability used by scientists used during their work, and the competencies displayed in solving scientific protriems [2] Scientists work. By testing ideas with evidence through scientific methods and involving the efficient use of the SPSs. When learners interact with the world in a scientific way, they find themselves observing, questioning, hypothesizing, predicting, investigating, interpreting, and communicating. These are often called the "process skills" of science.
