The central element of this repertoire is the motif of identity grounded in the Synoptic and Pauline institution narratives. The book argues that the statement 'The eucharistic bread and wine are the body and blood of Christ' can be understood both as figurative and as true in the proper sense, thus resolving a church-dividing dichotomy. The identity motif is complemented by four major non-scriptural motifs: representation, change, containment, and conduit. Each motif, with its entailments, is explored in depth, and suggestions for ecumenical reconciliation in both doctrine and practices are offered. The book also provides an introduction to cognitive linguistics and offers suggestions for further reading in that field.
