Creating Reality in Factual Television analyzes the uneasy interaction between economics culture and professional ethics in reality and documentary television storytelling Through the frankenbite an editorial tool that extracts and re orders the salient elements or single words of a statement interview or exchange into a revealing confession or argument the book explores how and why editors manipulate truth in factual television The author considers how the editing of documentary television is increasingly following reality television's dictate to entertain instead of inform how the real and the truth fall victim to the demand to tell entertaining stories and how editors must compromise their professional ethics as a result Drawing on interviews with 75 North American and European editors that explore their experiences and opinions of reality and documentary television practices and their views on their responsibilities and loyalties in the field *Creating Reality in Factual Television* illuminates the real and potential ethical dilemmas of editorial decision making the context in which

Parameters of Disavowal Jinsoo An, 2018-06-08 A free ebook version of this title is available through Luminos University of California Press's Open Access publishing program Visit www.luminosoa.org to learn more The colonial experience of the early twentieth century shaped Korea's culture and identity leaving a troubling past that was subtly reconstructed in South Korean postcolonial cinema Relating postcolonial discourses to a reading of Manchurian action films kisaeng and gangster films and revenge horror films *Parameters of Disavowal* shows how filmmakers reworked recontextualized and erased ideas and symbols of colonial power

In particular Jinsoo An examines how South Korean films privileged certain sites such as the kisaeng house and the Manchurian frontier generating unique meanings that challenged the domination of the colonial power and how horror films indirectly explored both the continuing trauma of colonial violence and lingering emotional ties to the colonial order. Espousing the ideology of nationalism while responding to a new Cold War order that positioned Japan and South Korea as political and economic allies postcolonial cinema formulated distinctive ways of seeing and imagining the colonial past.

Mapping Multimodal Performance Studies Maria Grazia Sindoni, Janina Wildfeuer, Kay O'Halloran, 2016-12-01 This book is a first attempt to map the broad context of performance studies from a multimodal perspective. It collects original research on traditional performing arts, theatre, dance, opera, live, durational performance and mediated, recorded performances, films, television shows as well as performative, discursive practices on social media by adopting several theories and methodologies all dealing with the notion of multimodality. As a mostly dynamic and also interactive environment for various text types and genres, the context of performance studies provides many opportunities to produce meaning verbally and non verbally. All chapters in this book develop frameworks for the analysis of performance related events and activities and explore empirical case studies in a range of different ages and cultures. A further focus lies on the communicative strategies deployed by different communities of practice taking into account processes of production, distribution and consumption of such texts in diverse spatial and temporal contexts.

Stan Brakhage in Rolling Stock, 1980-1990 Jerry White, 2018-04-19 This is a collection of writings by the giant of experimental cinema Stan Brakhage that shows him in a completely new light as part of world cinema. For the duration of the 1980s Brakhage contributed to the Boulder literary magazine *Rolling Stock* mostly publishing reports from the Telluride Film Festival. These reports show that Brakhage was keenly interested in world cinema, anxious to meet and dialogue with filmmakers of many different stripes. The book also contains substantial discussion of Brakhage's work in light of the filmmakers he encountered at Telluride and discussed in *Rolling Stock*. Long chapters are given over to Soviet filmmakers such as Andrei Tarkovsky, Larissa Shepitko and Sergei Parajanov as well as the German filmmaker Hans Jürgen Syberberg. Brakhage was a keen viewer of these filmmakers and their contemporaries both at Telluride and in his role as teacher at the University of Colorado. Stan Brakhage and *Rolling Stock* attempts to place his work alongside theirs and thus reclaim him for world cinema. The book's appendices reprint letters Brakhage wrote to Stella Pence, Telluride's co-founder and managing director as well as summaries of his work for Telluride and a brace of difficult to find reviews.

that the fiftieth anniversary film production contributed to France's move from a period of the return of the repressed to one of difficult anamnesis Donadey provides a close analysis of twenty narrative films made during this period on both side of the Mediterranean observing that while some films continue to center on the point of view of only one stake holding group a number of films open up new opportunities for multicultural French audiences to envision the war through the eyes of Algerian characters on screen and other films bring memories from various groups together in thoughtful articulations that represent the complexity of the situation Donadey takes this analysis a step further to analyze what types of gendered representations emerge in these films given the important participation of Algerian women in the revolutionary war Scholars of Francophone studies film women's studies and history will find this book particularly useful
