


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National Skills Fund

The book is framed as a contribution to southern and Africa centred scholarship adapting Amartya Sen's capability approach and a framework of key concepts capabilities functionings context conversion factors poverty and agency to investigate opportunities and obstacles to achieved student outcomes. This approach allows a reimagining of inclusive learning outcomes to encompass the multi dimensional value of a university education and a plurality of valued cognitive and non cognitive outcomes for students from low income backgrounds whose experiences are strongly shaped by hardship. Based on capability theorising and student voices the book proposes for policy and practice a set of contextual higher education capability domains and corresponding functionings orientated to more justice and more equality for each person to have the opportunities to be and to do what they have reason to value.
