Basics

1. Assess the load and the route you will be using
2. Use your legs to lift, NOT your back
3. Keep the load close to your body
4. Ask for assistance if the load is too heavy for 1 person or use mechanical aids to help such as a trolley
5. NEVER attempt to lift an object that is too heavy
