Case 16.3 HIV/AIDS

Rita and Pete live less than a mile apart in the same city, are the same age and have a significant commonality; both are living with human immunodeficiency virus (HIV). Their stories will be briefly shared as to the differences in origin of the illness and life thereafter.

Pete is 65 years old and has been HIV positive for 10 years. He lived in a heterosexual world the majority of his life. Married at age 22, Pete secured a position at his father's bank and generated a sizeable income in a short period of time. Two children were produced from the marriage, which lasted until his mid-50s. Pete was fully aware of his sexual preference for men since being a teenager, but never acted upon it until his wife died of ovarian cancer. He was raised in a strict southern Baptist home, was a star athlete in high school, well-known and respected in the community, and convinced himself that suicide was a better alternative than "coming out" as a gay male but chose not to go that route.

Following his wife's death and knowing his adult children were secure, Pete spent weekends in a city several hours from his home and explored his homosexuality with many men.

He partnered with one individual who became quite ill a month later, with what Pete was told was pneumonia. In actuality, this man was admitted for pneumocystis carinii, an opportunistic infection of acquired immune deficiency syndrome (AIDS) and died at the hospital. Pete tested positive for HIV shortly thereafter.

Rita's life was quite a contrast, in particular with financial security. She had several unsuccessful marriages, which produced five children in total. Child support was a rarity, and she always struggled to provide her children with the basics. Rita was a nursing assistant for decades and one shift incurred a needle stick in jury. A medical resident put a syringe with needle attached in a patient's trash bin following a bedside procedure. When emptying it, Rita was stuck to the point of bleeding heavily.
