

## Question 26

### Steps for Question 26:

1. Read the question.
2. What is the controlling idea? This is a topic. You have to come up with a **THEME** about that topic. For example: If the controlling idea is "Teen Struggle", your theme statement could be: **Both passages make it clear that the teen struggle is universal and often causes teenagers to withdraw from their families**
3. Choose examples from each text and explain how they relate to the controlling idea.

### Outline for Question 26:

1. In passage one and two, both authors make it clear that ..... insert controlling idea and your theme statement about that idea.
2. In passage one.....Example that supports your theme statement.....then Explain that example.
3. Additionally/whereas/similarly (use a transition!) In passage two.....Example that supports your theme statement.....Explain that example.
4. Both authors clearly support the controlling idea that.....Restate the controlling idea and your theme statement.

### Anchor Paper - Question 26 - Level 2 - A

All people must face the inevitable process of growing older, which sometimes leads to feelings of helplessness and apathy and a loss of enthusiasm about life. In both Passage I, an excerpt from a short story, and Passage II, a poem, characters must face the process of aging and the feelings that come with it. In Passage I, the narrator expresses the disappointment and cynicism that he has developed as he has grown older. He discusses adversities which he has faced such as "the perfidy of friends and the wickedness of the flesh, lost frontiers... the death of dreams, solitude, pain..." He mourns lost youth stating, "every loss is a tear in the heart's tender flesh," and ~~at the end of the~~ ~~passage~~ ~~with~~ The dog in Passage II has also lost the enthusiasm and excitement of youth. He is shown to be quite apathetic. No longer as playful as a young puppy, when his owner attempts to "toss his ragged stuffed lion," the dog will "seem to want to say 'you don't have to play with me. I'm fine' and then mosey over, and take the toy back to his spot." In each of these passages demonstrates the loss of enthusiasm and the disappointment that often come with aging.
