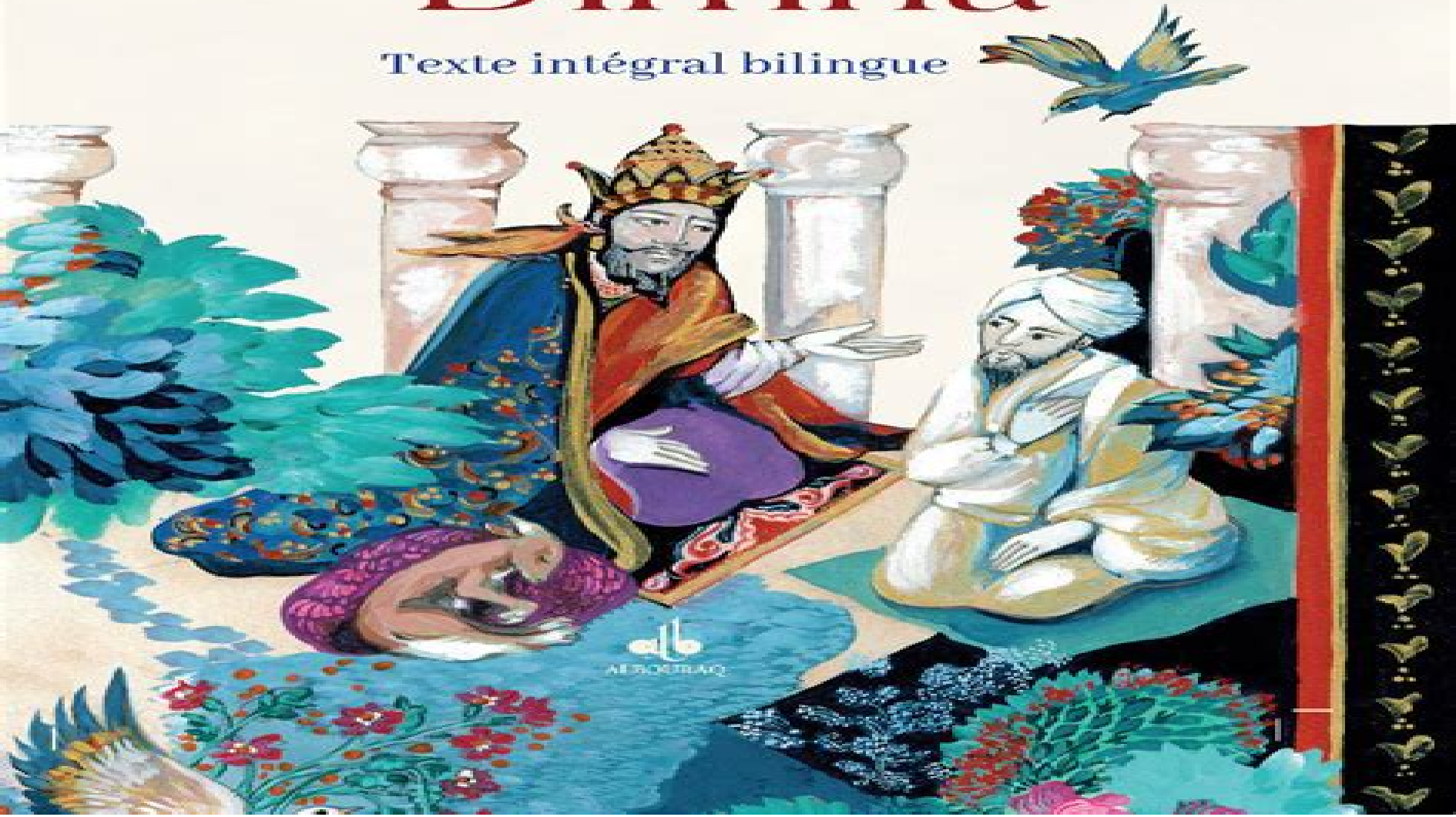

Meri, 2006 Examines the socio cultural history of the regions where Islam took hold between the 7th and 16th century This two volume work contains 700 alphabetically arranged entries and provides a portrait of Islamic civilization It is of use in understanding the roots of Islamic society as well to explore the culture of medieval civilization **Kalila and Dimna** Ramsay Wood, 2013-11 KALILA AND DIMNA or The Panchatantra also known in Europe since 1481 as The Fables of Bidpai is a multi layered inter connected and variable arrangement of animal stories with one story leading into another sometimes three or four deep These arrangements have contributed to world literature for over 2000 years migrating across ancient cultures in a multitude of written and oral formats All our beast fables from Aesop and the Buddhist Jataka Tales through La Fontaine to Uncle Remus owe this strange shape shifting book a huge debt In its original Arabic format Kalila and Dimna The Panchatantra being its Sanskrit precursor ostensibly constitutes a handbook for rulers a so called Mirror for Princes illustrating indirectly through a cascade of teaching stories and verse how to and how not to run the kingdom of your life In their slyly profound grasp of human nature at its best and worst these animal fables usually avoiding any moralistic

traveled widely We can identify for instance both the Vikings and the Arabs as global players long before the rise of modern globalism so this volume promises to rewrite many of our traditional notions about pre modern worldviews economic conditions and the literary sharing on a global level as perhaps best expressed by the genre of the fable
